Overview

- ▶ Multi-Jurisdictional Disparity Study recently completed for Jacksonville's Women & Minority-Owned Companies
- ▶ Disparity Study developed recommendations and goals for all Jacksonville Agencies
- ▶ Jacksonville Inter-Agency Joint Task Force has been established to address Disparity Study's findings and recommendations
- ▶ Jacksonville's action plan is to increase women and minority-owned contracting opportunities

Multi-Jurisdictional Disparity Study

- ▶ Mason Tillman completed a Multi-Jurisdictional Disparity Study for City of Jacksonville and its agencies in August 2013
- ▶ The study reviewed contract awards during a five year period from October 1, 2005 - September 30, 2010
- ▶ Disparity Study concluded Jacksonville's Women and Minority-owned Businesses are under-utilized at all Jacksonville Agencies
- ▶ Ethnic/gender categories reviewed were as follows:
 - African Americans
 - Asian Americans
 - Hispanic Americans
 - Native Americans
 - Minority Business Enterprises
 - Women Business Enterprises

Disparity Study Recommendations and Goals

- ▶ Primary recommendations to address Jacksonville's underutilization of Women and Minority-owned Companies include:
 - Unbundling Large Procurements
 - Increasing Networking Opportunities
 - Revising Insurance and Bonding Requirements
 - Conducting routine post-award Contract Compliance
 - Create a System to Report, Track and Collect all Subcontracting Payments

- ▶ All recommendations have four common goals:
 1. Increase pool of available vendors
 2. Increase participation on contracts
 3. Promote public perception of City Procurement
 4. Standardize local business processes to make contracting easier

Jacksonville Inter-Agency Joint Task Force

- ▶ Jacksonville Procurement Leadership is working together to address Disparity Study's recommendations and goals
- ▶ Task Force consists of representatives from the following:
 - City of Jacksonville
 - Jacksonville Port Authority
 - Jacksonville Aviation Authority
 - Jacksonville Transportation Authority
 - Duval County Public Schools
 - JEA
 - Small Business Administration
- ▶ Task force is meeting every 2 weeks to put plan into action

Task Force Plan of Action

- ▶ Collaborate across Jacksonville Agencies to increase the pool and participation of Women & Minority-Owned Companies
- ▶ Initially target the 1,300 Jacksonville Women & Minority-Owned Companies identified in the Disparity Study
 - Invite Women and Minority-Owned Companies Outreach Events Organized by the Agency's Task Force Committee
 - Obtain Vendor Feedback on past experience with City Procurement
 - Increase contracting opportunities on upcoming projects
 - Provide training on how to do business with Jacksonville Agencies
- ▶ Implement solutions that address Disparity Study's recommendations and goals
- ▶ Develop Performance Metrics to measure success of Action Plan

What Is the DBE Program?

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program is a comprehensive program developed by the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) which establishes guidelines for the participation of firms owned by socially and economically disadvantaged persons in DOT-assisted contracting. Transportation agencies awarding more than \$250,000 in federally-funded contracts, such as JTA, are required to participate in the DBE program.

Why Do We Have It?

The DBE Program ensures nondiscrimination in the award of federally-funded contracts by creating a "level playing field" on which DBEs can fairly compete. By helping to remove barriers that may limit the participation of these firms, JTA is able to assist in their development so they can successfully compete in the general marketplace.

What Is DBE Certification?

To qualify for DBE status, a small business must be a for-profit concern that meets the following criteria:

1. Average annual gross revenues of no more than \$22.41 million over the three previous years.
2. Personal net worth of the owner(s) not exceeding \$1.32 million.
3. Must be at least 51% owned and controlled by one or more socially and disadvantage individuals.

What Are The Benefits of Being Certified?

- Access to contracting and procurement opportunities at the JTA and transportation agencies statewide.
- Inclusion in the DBE Database maintained by the Florida Uniform Certification Program (UCP).
- Management and technical assistance and referrals from the JTA and its partners.
- Access to seminars and networking events sponsored by the JTA and other agencies.
- Opportunity to develop professional contacts with larger non-DBE firms.

CERTIFICATION CRITERIA FOR DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE)

1. Business/firm owner by the Socially Disadvantage Business owner must be FOR PROFIT;
2. Socially Disadvantage Business Owner must hold the highest position in the company;
3. Socially Disadvantage Business Owner must manage and control daily operations of the business/firm;
4. The Socially Disadvantage Business Owner/s MUST own a minimum of 51% of the business/firm;
5. The Personal Net Worth of each Socially Disadvantage Business Owner cannot exceed \$1.32 Million dollars – this excludes their primary residence and ownership in the business.
6. Socially Disadvantage Business Owner –business gross receipts average , for the past three years, cannot exceed \$22.41 million dollars;
7. Socially Disadvantage Business Owner must have experience in the business industry in which they are the majority owner;
8. Socially Disadvantage Business Owner must submit their last three years of Personal Tax Returns and last three years of Business Tax Returns. If the business has not been operational for three years, then business tax returns for the years the business was operational;

9. Once a **complete** application (all required documentation) has been submitted the entire process can take up to 2-3 weeks. The application will be processed by the DBE/Diversity Specialist. It will then be forwarded to the Diversity and Equity Program Manager for review and scheduling of the **On-Site Review**. This On-Site review allows DBE staff to come and view/inspect the business. A series of questions will be asked at that time of the business owner/s. This visit normally last about 60-90 minutes. This site visit must take place with the Socially Disadvantaged Business Owner/s and where the business is located.

Note: We request that no meetings take place where only a female is present with JTA staff. We ask that another adult (age 18+) be present.

10. Burden of proof is always on the applicant during the certification phrase to prove they are a viable company that is ready, willing and able to perform work on a DOT, should it be awarded.

The City of Jacksonville Small and Emerging Business Program:

- Is a Race and Gender Neutral Program
- Requirements are:
 - Net worth of \$605,000 or less
 - Majority owner (51%) must live in Duval, St. Jones, Baker, Nassau, or Clay County
 - Business must be headquartered in Duval County for minimum of 1 year
 - Must be a for-profit business
- The City of Jacksonville reviews ONLY formal and informal City Contracts. We do NOT review contracts for other Agencies.
- The City of Jacksonville has 4 categories
 1. Participation- percentage of city contract is performed by a certified small business
 2. Encouragement- open to all vendors
 3. Set A-sides- contracts for certified small business only
 4. Section 3- Federal contracts provided by Housing Department
- The City of Jacksonville waived certified small business bonding requirements for contracts under \$500,000.
- The Mayor approved on 03/10/14 an RFP to enter into contract negotiations for A Bonding Assistance Program.
- The City of Jacksonville Small Business program alerts certified vendors of current bidding opportunities on Facebook.
- The City of Jacksonville hosts a minimum of 4 workshops per month. (Ex. Tax, marketing, QuickBooks, OSHA, and etc.)
- The City of Jacksonville per ordinance is authorized to unbundle contracts for minimum of 3 vendors that are ready, willing, and able to perform the service.

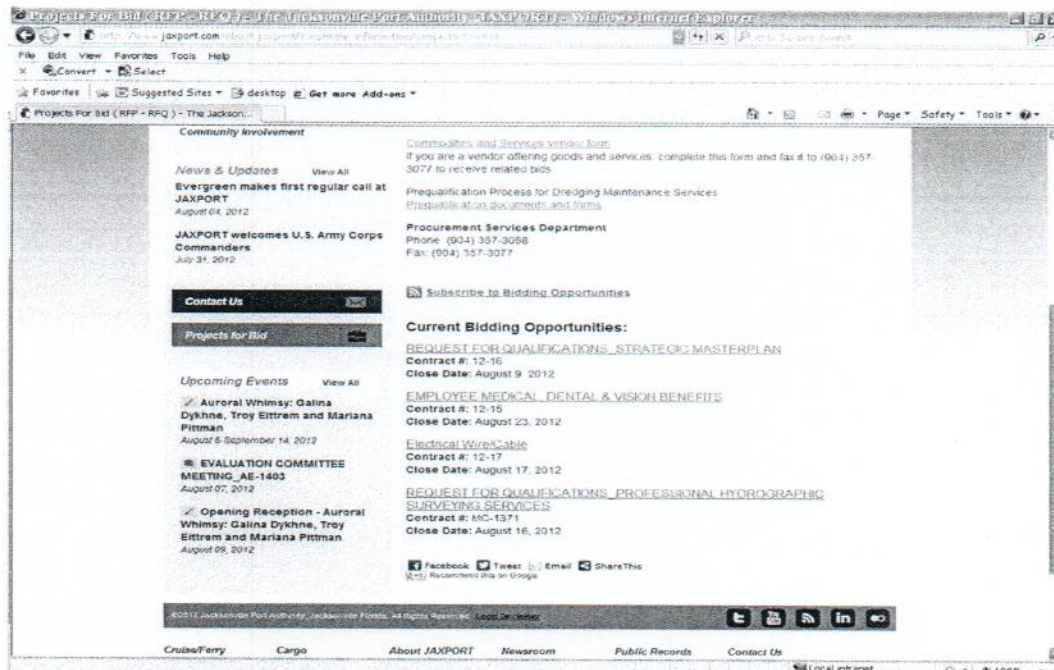
