The Law and Your Business

The Law and Your Business – 2025 Florida Legislative Session Tony Zebouni, Lindell, Farson & Zebouni, P.A.

The 2025 Florida Legislative session is upon us. As you may know, the legislature has been busy in Committee meetings which is a prelude to the actual General Session. The deadline to file all requests for drafts of general bills is January 24, 2025. All drafts of general bills must be approved and in final form by February 28, 2025. The regular session convenes on March 4, 2025, for 60 days (May 2, 2025). The only legislation mandated is the passage of a balanced budget during the regular session but there are generally thousands of bills filed each year with only a few hundred that ever get approved and sent to the Governor's desk for consideration. There are already bills filed for consideration in advance of the Regular Session and here are a few "proposed" bills that you may find interesting, though it is not likely that many if any will be approved in their current form and content.

HB 31 among other things will provide for open carry of firearms in Florida. HB 33 proposes an Agreement Among States to elect president by Popular Vote (an effort to bypass the electoral college. SB 44 Increasing the penalty for having red or red & blue lights on the front of a vehicle (unless you're a first responder) to a third-degree felony. SB 53 would regulate the sale of ammunition and would require a background check to transfer/purchase ammunition under certain circumstances. HB 25 would remove the prohibition on the limitation on parents and children's recovery for wrongful death due to medical malpractice.

These are just a few of the already filed bills that will be considered in the 2025 Regular Session.

I encourage all NUCAS members to be active and aware in the legislative process and if you have any questions or concerns should contact Tony Zebouni or Mike Kivlin. You should also consider joining the NUCA team when it attends the annual "Walk the Halls" in Tallahassee early in the Session.

House Passes Final NUCA Supported WRDA Legislation

The House passed on Dec. 10 the final version of the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA, and labeled for this vote as S. 4367). NUCA strongly supported this bill, writing in our media statement, "This bipartisan bill will deliver water infrastructure resources to many critical projects around the nation." The Senate has agreed to the House bill's framework and policies, and is expected to vote on the bill before Congress recesses later this month, sending it to the President for his signature.

Federal Court Strikes Down New Overtime Rules

A Texas federal court struck down on Nov. 15 all of USDOL's 2024 changes to the overtime rules. This decision invalidates the rule nationwide for all employers. This means that employers may revert to the 2019 salary threshold of \$684 per week (\$43,888 per year) to determine whether employees are exempt or non-exempt. The court found that USDOL had exceeded its authority, since Congress had intended for an employee's job duties to determine exemption status, not salary level. This decision may be appealed, but the new Trump Administration may decide to halt any appeal after taking office on Jan. 20.

NUCA announced Dec. 10 that it hired its new director of safety, Edward DeNeale, CHST, to lead the association's safety programs. "Safety for our industry's employees is a core value at NUCA," said NUCA CEO Doug Carlson. "Ed's extensive background in industry safety programs will allow NUCA to take our existing safety and training programs and expand them for our membership." New Year Home Safety Tips

Recently, we were talking about, what would be a good time to do a safety check in our home? Suggestions were holidays, birthdays, annual events, or anything that would help us remember to check those things that we need to keep an eye on. Have you ever had a battery-operated device corroded and unusable because the batteries have exploded and the green residue inside has dissolved the workings? Why does that happen? We lose track of when we installed the batteries. We don't get much of a warning when it happens except when we go to use it. By then its to late. Other devices are subject to the same failure possibility. Smoke alarms, fire extinguishers, carbon monoxide detectors (carbon monoxide is a tasteless odorless gas that will kill you undetected). How about fire extinguishers? Do you have enough of them? Are they in the right place? Do you know where the right place is? Some people don't realize that the laundry room is a prime location. We had a house near us that burned due to a dryer fire. How often do you check the dryer for lint accumulation? Did you know that a fire extinguisher has an expiration date? It's usually five years. Have you inspected your fire extinguisher to see if it workable? It should be inspected every 30 days or at the very least annually. Do you have a fire escape plan? How about functioning windows. Can you open a window and escape if you need to? Many older homes have windows that are painted shut. Making a list of things to check and designating a specific time to make those safety checks is essential for the safety of our homes and those we care about. The New Year is a perfect time for accomplishing these things. We can't forget that it's a new year. We might forget a birthday or an anniversary (which is another kind of safety hazard) but it's not easy to forget it's a new year. Take time to develop and do your safety checks and have a safety and happy 2025.


