The Law and Your Business

The Law and Your Business- Unlicensed Contracting Tony Zebouni, Lindell & Zebouni, PA

In December 2020, homeowner hired a business("ULC") to build a single-family home on their property in Fernandina Beach, Florida. The business owner was a certified general contractor, obtained a building permit under his own name and supervised the project. Before construction was complete, however, the contract was terminated. The business entity filed suit to collect monies owed due to the termination.

The Court held that the parties' contract was unenforceable by ULC because it, a limited liability company, was an unlicensed contractor, even though the owner was licensed because its owner and who performed as its qualifying agent but failed to apply for registration or certification on behalf of the business, as required by section 489.119(2), Florida Statutes. ULC also argued it should still recover under the contract for work that did not require a license.

In Florida, all "contractors" must be certified or registered with the DBPR. § 489.115(1), Fla. Stat. (2020). When any business organization other than a sole proprietorship intends to engage in construction contracting, the applicant must apply for registration or certification as the qualifying agent of the business organization. To qualify a business organization contractor for the first time, the agent must apply to the Construction Industry Licensing Board and submit certain documents and a fee. If the Board determines the business is qualified, the Department will issue the business organization a certificate or registration.

Under Florida law, only a licensed contractor can enforce its contracts. "As a matter of public policy, contracts entered into by an unlicensed contractor shall be unenforceable in law or in equity by the unlicensed contractor. To be considered licensed, a business organization contractor must have a qualifying agent that is itself licensed to perform the work contemplated in the contract. A business organization is unlicensed if the business organization does not have a primary or secondary qualifying agent in accordance with this part concerning the scope of the work to be performed under the contract. Whether a business organization is a licensed contractor within the meaning of section 489.128 turns on whether the business organization is legally associated with a person licensed for the type of work to be performed under the contract as of the effective date of the contract.

The contract was entered into by ULC when its owner was a certified general contractor who could have served as qualifying agent but that doesn't satisfy the statutory requirements to be licensed. The ULC owner could have signed the contract on his own behalf with no mention of the entity, but he would lose certain protections that inure to corporations or LLCs.

The ULC owner could not become ULC's qualifying agent until he applied with the Board and was issued a certificate or registration by the Department. Initial issuance' means the first time a certificate or registration is granted to a. business organization, including the first time an individual becomes a qualifying agent for that business organization and the first time a business organization is qualified by that individual." As an unlicensed contractor, ULC could not enforce the contract. If a contract is rendered unenforceable under this section, no lien or bond claim shall exist in favor of the unlicensed contractor for any labor, services, or materials provided under the contract or any amendment thereto.

ULC was an unlicensed contractor that could not enforce the parties' contract. Because ULC was never qualified as a business organization contractor by the DBPR, because a qualifying agent never applied with the DBPR on behalf of ULC the business was unlicensed when it executed the contract it could not enforce the contract.

Industry News and Advocacy

UCA Workforce Development Wins In One Big Beautiful Bill!

NUCA celebrated a major workforce development policy victory in the newly signed "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" (OBBB, H.R. 1), capping off years of advocacy for increased educational and training opportunities for the American utility construction industry and those seeking a fulfilling career within it.

"The Workforce Pell Grant program created under the One Big Beautiful Bill Act is a transformative win for America's utility construction workforce," remarked Zack Perconti, NUCA's Vice President of Government Affairs. This workforce development program for the American utility construction industry was a top advocacy goal sought by NUCA's Washington Summit attendees. Our Summit work over the past three years paid off!

The new law signed on July 4 expands federal Pell Grant eligibility by establishing the Workforce Pell Grant program, allowing students without a higher education degree or not already enrolled in a program to receive Pell Grants for attending career and technical education (CTE) programs that provide between 150 to 600 clock hours of instructional time over 8 to 15 weeks.

Beneficial Business Tax Reforms Signed Into Law

The OBBB also included several business tax provisions supported by NUCA that will directly benefit utility contractors. The bill permanently extends the Section 199A deduction for S corporations, ensuring long-term certainty for businesses, while preserving the 37% top tax rate. Additional welcome reforms include restoring the R&D tax credit and full expensing, relaxing the interest expense limitation, and implementing other pro-growth measures designed by Congress and the Administration to strengthen American businesses and stimulate economic expansion.

USDOL Reduces Small Business Penalties

The U.S. Department of Labor announced July 14 it has revised OSHA's Field Operations Manual to reduce penalties for small businesses to encourage prompt hazard abatement. The updated policy expands penalty reductions, increasing the 70% reduction from businesses with 10 or fewer employees to those with up to 25 employees. It also introduces a 15% penalty reduction for employers who quickly address hazards. Additionally, businesses with no history of serious, willful, repeat, or failure-to-abate OSHA violations qualify for further reductions. OSHA stated that these changes aim to help small businesses allocate resources instead toward compliance and safety. The new policies take effect immediately, but penalties issued before July 14, 2025, follow the previous structure.

Back to School Safety

It's hard to believe that summer is over for kids returning to school. Some safety reminders for the kids going back to school and for us, as motorists, might be a good idea. More than 100 school children are injured each year in accidents that occur inside school zones. From 2013 to 2022 over 1,000 people died in school transportation related crashes. 38% of these fatalities were pedestrian. These statistics highlight the need for increased awareness among all road users.

Students

If you have a child going to school for the first time, be sure they know their phone number and address and how to get hold of another trusted adult. It's also helpful for them to know how to contact emergency services (911).

Teach them not to talk to strangers or accept rides from someone they do not know.

Teach them to use sidewalks and stop and look right and left before crossing the road.

Cross streets at the corner, stay in the crosswalk and obey traffic signals.

If your student rides the school bus, get to the bus stop early and stay away from the curb. Board only the designated school bus and never an alternate one.

If your child is driving, make sure they buckle up and never use their cell phone while driving.

If you get your student a cell phone, download emergency aps and real time weather alerts.

Drivers

Be aware of school zones. Obey speed restrictions in school zones. Flashing yellow school bus lights are an indication that a stop is coming up. Do not try to pass before the stop is made and never pass when red lights are flashing. Do not proceed until all the children have reached safety.

Our children are our future, and they depend on us and need our protection to be sure they are safe from hazards that are under our control. Drive safely.




