## The Law and Your Business

The Law and Your Business- Liability for corrosion in copper pipes Tony Zebouni, Lindell & Zebouni, P.A.

Residents brought an action alleging that the water which the City had delivered to them from the water plant was improperly treated and had caused irreversible damage to all the copper pipes. The water plant receives groundwater and uses nanofiltration and reverse osmosis that removes various minerals, including calcium and sodium hydroxide which are necessary to create a coating inside copper pipes preventing their corrosion. The City failed to add back these minerals following treatment, which caused the finished water to be non-protecting of the copper pipes to corrosion.

The City contracted with Consultant for professional planning and design engineering consulting services. Consultant analyzed the water plant's treated water and determined the alkalinity and hardness levels were below recommended levels, resulting in corrosive finished water. Consultant recommended the City include corrosion control inhibitors, but did not recommend that it add calcium carbonate to the finished water. The City did not make its water non-corrosive after receiving Consultant's report, analysis, and recommendations. After residents complained, the City again contracted with Consultant to evaluate its finished water to provide residents with answers. In an apparent attempt to shield itself from liability for previous inadequate advice to the City, Consultant claimed that the finished water was not contributing to any accelerated corrosion, but that potential non-water related causes contributed. The City advised residents to replace their pipes at their own expense and offered a program for residents to borrow up to \$10,000 from the City to pay for the new pipes.

A lawsuit ensued by the Residents against the City and the Consultant.

A court previously held that a municipality is not an insurer or guarantor of the quality of water it furnishes. However, a municipality may be held liable for injuries resulting from its negligence in permitting its water supply to become contaminated or polluted, thereby causing illness or an epidemic. In Florida it is the policy of the state to assure that safe drinking water is available. To this end a municipality which supplies water for public consumption must furnish potable drinking water, i.e., water fit for human consumption."

Whenever one undertakes to provide a service to others, whether one does so gratuitously or by contract, the individual who undertakes to provide the service thereby assumes a duty to act carefully and to not put others at an undue risk of harm. The City failed to add the necessary minerals back to its treated water to render it non-corrosive. This alleged failure to exercise reasonable care by adding back necessary minerals to the treated water increased the risk of the residents' harm because that failure caused serious corrosion of the copper pipes

Despite the lack of a direct contract between the Consultant (professional) and the aggrieved party. A professional duty may arise in favor of a third party as a result of a matter of law or as a result of a contract between parties, or by virtue of a gratuitous undertaking. Also, an engineer is considered a professional, and, accordingly, has been held liable as such for failure to exercise due care in rendering professional services.

#### **NUCA Coalition Submits Final Comments on OSHA Heat Rule**

NUCA and our partners in the Construction Industry Safety Coalition (CISC) submitted to OSHA our comments on Oct. 30 highlighting our concerns with their proposed heat rule. "The proposed one-size-fits-all standard does not allow for the needed flexibility for the construction industry... Several of the proposed requirements will create greater hazards for construction workers due to the nature of the tasks performed on a construction worksite, such as those performed at heights or around machinery... A separate rule is imperative as construction work is vastly different from general industries," wrote NUCA's coalition in the comments.

NUCA continues to emphasize the industry's traditional approach to working in the heat: hydration, shade, rest, and safety training. Construction is a unique environment and deserves its own set of OSHA heat regulations. We will keep the industry informed when OSHA releases its final rule. ## SAFETY NEWS

#### **Holiday Safety Tips**

The holiday season brings happily anticipated joy to everyone, but that joy could turn to sadness if safety becomes an issue. Here are some hints to have a safe and happy holiday.

**Drive safely.** The holidays are the biggest travel days of the year. Prepare for the trip by making sure the vehicle is maintained and follow safe driving guidelines. Buckle up and put the cell phone away. Don't drink and drive.

**Decorate safely.** If you use an artificial tree, make sure it's labeled "fire resistant". If you are using a live tree keep it watered. Use unbreakable ornaments. Keep smaller ornaments up out of reach of children.

**Lighting.** Make sure that you are using indoor lights indoors and outside lights outside. Don't overload circuits and follow stringing guidelines. Follow package directions. Turn off decorating when leaving the house.

**Fire starters.** Candles and fireplaces are a source of ignition. Screen the fireplace, make sure the chimney is safe, place candles where children cannot access them. Never leave candles unattended.

**Turkey Fryers.** Frying turkeys cause hundreds of fires each year along with burns and other injuries. Research and apply frying safety guidelines.

**Food safety.** Use sanitary guidelines. Avoid cross contamination. Refrigerate hot or cold leftover food within two hours of being served. Leftovers are safe for three to four days when properly refrigerated.

**Gifting safely.** Toys are age rated for children and their intellectual ability. Avoid small parts for children under 3. For children under 10, avoid toys that must be plugged in. If giving battery operated toys that have button batteries or magnets be aware they can be fatal if swallowed.

**Stay warm and safe.** Hypothermia is a risk in cold weather. Check temperatures and dress accordingly. Exposure to rain and subsequent wet clothing exposes the wearer to hypothermia.

**Signs of hypothermia.** When the body's core temperature falls below 95 degrees, hypothermia begins. Severe shivering, drowsiness or exhaustion, shallow breathing, loss of coordination and unconsciousness can lead to death.

**First aid for hypothermia.** Move the person out of the cold. Remove wet clothing. Warm the person with blankets or warm clothing. Give warm, not hot, drinks. Do not give alcohol or caffeine. More serious concerns call 911.

Holidays can be a source of joy and celebration and following the simple rules for safety can ensure a safe and happy holiday for everyone. Happy holidays.
